Attendance and Extended Vacations:

When planning vacations, please note the language from HCPSS policy #9010 - Student Attendance:

Absences for Non-emergency Circumstances

- a. A written request for such absences to be lawful/excused should be submitted in advance to the principal/designee.
- b. Such absences may not occur during exam or state-mandated testing periods unless authorized by the principal/designee.
- c. For absences of up to 3 days per year, the principal may determine whether the absences will be lawful/excused or unlawful/unexcused. Such absences may include, but are not limited to, the following events directly involving the student:
 - i. Visits to post-secondary institutions
 - ii. Participation in college orientation programs
 - iii. Scheduled interviews with prospective employers
 - iv. Special family events, including vacations/trips.

Check for current vacancies on the left hand-side or Start an application as an Internal Applicant. This is found on the Welcome page below the two hands shaking.

You should start an application as an external applicant if you have never work for us before. You will need to create a log-in which is your email address and a pass-code. Once you have completed your initial profile, you will need to proceed to page 4 and 5 of the application. You will see various positions that include "Substitute/Temporary" and click the position for 'Substitute Teacher' then complete the work history for the past 10 years. This includes paid and volunteer work as well as periods of unemployment.

You must also list three professional references from your most recent supervisor, manager, professor or university adviser. We do not accept references from friends, or co-workers. The final item is a copy of your Official college/university transcript. This document should be scanned and attached to your application. You can go back at any time to edit or make changes to your application.

Please submit an application at your convenience and contact me after your application has been submitted and all three electronic references have responded back on your behalf. Be sure to include their correct email address and complete contact information. You may view the status of their response at any time by logging into your application to check.





Martin Luther King, Jr. Essay Contest

The Howard County Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday Commission will host the Annual Martin Luther King, Jr. Celebration on January 15, 2017. County Executive Allan H. Kittleman has recognized the importance of this event to our community by making the organizing group a permanent county commission. A highlight of the celebration is the award presentations to Howard County Middle School and High School students who are our essay contest winners.

Dr. King's historic speech, "I have a Dream http://archives.gov/press/exhibits/dream-speech.pdf remains as relevant today as it was in 1963. The Howard County MLK Holiday Commission invites your students to describe their dreams and vision for their world in their essay submission.





The individual essay focuses on both the present and the future. Students are invited to write an essay about their own dreams for a better community and a better world, demonstrated through leadership, service, inventions etc. and what they envision themselves doing. **The deadline for submission has been extended to Friday, December 2, 2016. The essays must be submitted by email in Word format**. Students with disabilities can submit a poster or use other media to portray their ideas for the present and the future.
